Supplies

You will Need:

- [Laser Cut Wood Frame](#)
- [Paint](#)
- [Paintbrush](#)
- [Pencil](#)
- [Ruler](#)
- [Bulldog Clips](#)
- [E6000 Glue](#)
- [Photo](#)
- [Foam Mounting Squares](#)
- [Command Adhesive Strip](#)

Instructions:



Collect your supplies.



Spray or paint your laser cut frame.

You will want at least 2 coats of paint. You may need 3 depending on how your paint covers the wood.



After the paint has dried. Use a pencil and a ruler to mark out where the bulldog clips will be placed.

Make sure they are level or at the same height on the frame.

Mark a straight line across where the bulldog clips will go. It will make it easiest to get the exact spot when you adhere the clip with the E6000.



Add a small amount of E6000 on the back of the bulldog clip.



Adhere the clip where you marked the frame.

Wait the full drying time to allow the E6000 to cure.



Add your picture to your clips.

If you live in a place with humidity, add small adhesive foam squares to the bottom corners of the picture to hold it in place and help keep the corners from curling in the humidity.



Hang your wall art.

You are done!

Notes:



After your wall art has been hung on the wall, you can add one Command Adhesive strip in the corner.

By adding it to the corner, it keeps the wall art on the wall level. That way the picture frame doesn't slip and slide around on the walls and become un-level.
